Welcome/Introduction/Over view	Meeting Overview The meeting began with member introductions and focused community initiatives, including discussions on co-housing models, intergenerational programs, and future activities for Older Americans Month. The workgroup also reviewed recent successes, such as the Valentine's Day card project, and upcoming events.
2.	HUG Reading Initiative Ema Wessels	HUG (Help Us Grow) Kentucky representative Ema Wessels will present the HUG reading initiative and how tutorship looks like. No speaker from Help Us Grow (HUG KY) today; they will join in April.
3.	Recap and discussion on the Louisville CoHousing Presentation Feb 11th	Co-Housing Initiative Follow-Up  Recap of the recent virtual co-housing discussion: Some attendees were expecting different presentation content. Questions raised: What neighborhood? How big? What are the shared home options? Response: Several neighborhoods are being considered, but no location is finalized yet. Reference made to Norton Commons, which has a similar concept. Relevance to Social Inclusion: Focus on intergenerational living and community support. Concerns and Key Questions: Diversity (ability/disability inclusion, economic accessibility). Funding sources and real estate acquisition. Parking, accessibility, retention, and inclusivity. Ensuring homes are move-in ready for aging in place. Potential Partnerships:  Mattingly Edge and Day Spring (organizations providing services for individuals with disabilities) have engaged in discussions. Discussion on the "village model" concept where owners and subsidized owners have equal voices. Legislative bills in Frankfort related to rezoning and religious organizations were noted.  Kaye provided an update on the Housing Workgroup discussion from the previous week. Discussions covered affordability, inventory shortages, and multigenerational housing needs. Urban-rural disparities, internet access, and housing as a social determinant of health were highlighted. The need for wraparound services during housing transitions was emphasized (Parkway Apartments and Dosker Manor). The group plans to engage with the housing authority on solutions.  Next Steps for Co-Housing Initiative  Gather clarity on key questions before proceeding. Monitor legislative developments related to co-housing. Attend the March 25th co-housing meeting (Debbie, connect to other workgroup members that attended the other info sessions)
