



Vision for the Domain

Louisville will have more inclusive, accessible spaces that promote safety, engagement, and well-being for all ages. This includes enhancing green areas with access, seating, and accommodations to support inclusive community gatherings. The focus on beautification will foster welcoming, enjoyable environments.

Action Plan Overview





Goal 1: Walkability



Enhance walkability and accessibility in targeted Louisville area(s)

Objective 1: Coordinate/perform 2 walk audits per year in identified suburban and urban areas.

- Review Vision Zero pedestrian data.
- Review data every 6 months to identify sites of concern
- Plan at least 6 walk audits at the pre-selected areas (3 by recommendation).



Goal 2: Beautification



Advocate for beautification to improve pedestrian and vehicular use and boost neighborhood safety.

Objective 1: Beautify parks and senior sites.

- Partner with site directors and community volunteers.
- Plan and host an event to enhance safety and appearance.

Objective 2: Clean up high-traffic neighborhoods.

- Identify suitable areas.
- Plan and host three cleanup events.





Goal 3: Usability of Public Spaces



Improve the overall Experience and Usability of Public Spaces.

Objective 1: Meet with local venue representatives to discuss accessibility.

- Identify event venues and meeting spaces across the city.
- Conduct face-to-face meetings with venues/meeting space staff to discuss accessibility.
- Strengthen partnerships.
- Recommend improvements that enhance actions #1 to 3.

- Annual assessments

Objective 2: Advocate for age-friendly housing policies in new construction.

- Work with officials and encourage developers
- Advocate in future community development plans



Goal 2: Home Modifications & ADUs



Raise awareness of affordable home modifications and ADUs.

Objective 1: Identify funding for home modifications.

- Research and list funding options for home repairs/modifications.
- Attend events to educate the community on multigenerational living and Age-Friendly housing.
- Identify partners, including nonprofits and housing agencies, for funding and grant opportunities.

Objective 2: Access resources for ADUs.

Research and create an ADU guide for Age-Friendly housing.

Objective 2: Plan and attend outreach events.

- Participate in and organize events using faith-based and student networks.
- Work with local leaders to sustain support.
- Partner with universities for program evaluation.
